

# **NRDP** Response

### Drought Affected Areas of District Tharparkar

#### **Background:**

Tharparkar District lies in 690 3" 35' to 710 7" 47' east longitudes and 240 9" 35' to 250 43" 6' north latitudes. The district consists of 6 Talukas 44 Union Councils and 166 Mouuzas . The district is mostly desert-like and comprises of barren tracts of sand dunes covered with thorny shrubs. Since the district is a desert, sweet water is scarce and is available only in some areas of Nagarparkar and Chachro while, in rest of the areas, people consume brackish water.



#### **Current Situation:**

The situation is still disturbing in the drought affected Tharparkar as more children are hospitalized due to malnutrition. Hospitals are overburdened, humanitarian partners are engage in relief and health activites. Reports from the field teams shows that the situation is still alarming in the areas. Issues regarding malnutrition and animal health are still prevailing. Mother and child health situation is still intense.

According to Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) Sindh, till now March 24, 2014 total 188 persons have died; male 49, female 30, children 109 . 66229 cattle have affected and 2044 have perished.



#### NRDP Response

NRDP Disaster Preparedness and Management (DPM) teams are engaged in the relief activites in the famine-hit areas of district Tharparkkar . So far NRDP has provided MNCH services to 1294 drought affected families , 844 affected animal vaccinated, 135 families provided with dry food and rations , 150 people senstized through health and hygiene sessions , 105 people educated on livestock management skills with the support of Niamat trust.





#### A). Medical Camps:

NRDP organised health camps in the affected areas of Tharparkar. The mobile health team comprising of male & female doctors with qualified paramedical staff provided todate medical aid to 1294 patients in Taluka Diplo.

#### B). Health/ Hygiene and Malnutrition Promotion:

NRDP is organizing health / hygiene and malnutrition promotional sessions in the most affected villages of Taluka Diplo. The primary objective of these sessions is to sanitize the drought affected communities in Thar. Todate 150 community members sensitized and educated.

#### C). Animal Health Services and Community **Awareness on livestock management:**

NRDP team comprising 2 male veterinary doctors providing animal health services in the drought affected areas of distric Tharparkar. So far 844 animals have examined and vaccinated (290 sheep, 397 Goats, 243 cows and 13 camels). The team is organizing broader community awareness on animal disease prevention and cure. In animals diseases like sheep-pox, foot & mouth disease, peste des petits ruminants(PPR) and anthrax are very common. Total 105 people were awarded on proper livestock management.

NRDP field team conducted detail assessment for the distribution food packs to the most vulnerable families. NRDP distributed food packs to 135 families with the support of Naimat Trust having proportion of 45 men & 90 women beneficiaries.
